# General Information I

- One-semester courses
- Courses are either **lectures** (up to 100 students) or **seminars** (ca 20–25 students)
- courses take place **once a week** and consist of 2 teaching hours (= 90 minutes)
  - a few exceptions, i.e. Irish Week – blocks

# General Information II

Students are informed about the form of evaluation and exam requirements during the introductory class in each course.

Generally, students are obliged to

- comply with the required attendance policy (usually a maximum of 2 absences per semester), and
- submit assigned work on time, and
- take tests and exams as required

Assigned work may have the form of home assignments, oral presentations, reports, written essays, group projects, etc.

Please note that **unless cooperation with other students is explicitly allowed by the teacher**, all assignments **have to be done independently, and using AI or copying and pasting answers from the Internet is not allowed**

# Credits

- The number of credits corresponds to the number of ECTS credits (European Credit Transfer System).
- Usually 3–4 credits per course at the English dept.
- Ours is an “all or nothing system”, i.e. if a course is a 3-credit course, you cannot get 2 credits for meeting the requirements only partially



# Forms of Assessment

- Most courses are completed with a **pre-exam credit** = PC = Pass/Fail) only (**no grade**)
- Only two courses have a pre-exam credit plus an end-of-course exam (KAA/UJoo, KAA/ULoo)
- Some courses are also associated with **graded exams**; these exams have their own codes and can be taken separately after the prerequisite course has been completed (not obligatory for international students!)
- 1 credit for a regular exam; 2 credits for a comprehensive exam (a comprehensive exam covers topics from more than one course)
- Exams are assessed by grades A to F.
- Each exam can be retaken twice.

# How to Get Grades I

- If you need a grade but there is only a *PC* (pre-exam credit) for the course (= Pass/Fail), there are two options:

## **Option 1 (the easier one)**

- the teacher will put points in the “Points” section in STAG after you have completed the course
- the points will then be automatically exported as a grade to your Transcript of Records at the end of your stay
- if you’ve earned an E, you will get 50; D = 60, C = 70, B = 80, A = 90 and up; F = fail, less than 49

!! Please note that these points are NOT percentage points (i.e. the passing grade is NOT 50) – this is just a way of converting results into grades where STAG does not allow a regular grade

# How to Get Grades II

## Option 2:

- you can take the separate exam if there is one for the course (check the UP Portal or see below) for an extra credit
- note that the 2-credit exams are comprehensive, i.e. cover the content of two or more courses (i.e. unless you take both courses, you might not qualify for the exam)
- we don't generally recommend this option, so please talk to the English dept. coordinator before you enrol in an exam

# Which courses can you take?

- Your timetable shows courses taught in English (colour-coded)
- Incoming exchange students can choose the colour-coded courses under the following conditions:
- All courses require at least a **B2** level of English (official certificate required)
- Master's (MA) courses require at least a **C1** level of English (official certificate required)
- Master's (MA) courses are **not** intended for Bachelor (BA) students (see our web for an overview)
- Some courses may have prerequisites and/or require some previous knowledge and/or require knowledge of Czech (check UP Portal or ask the teacher)

# How to enrol?

- If the course is available and you meet the language requirements etc., sign up for it electronically via UP Portal
- At the English dept., it is often the case that the courses are **full**: you need to **attend the first lesson** and check with the teacher whether they can take you
- If they do, make an appointment with the English dept. coordinator. **This cannot be done via email, you need to come personally by the end of the second week (21 February 2025)**
- If there are pre-requisites which do not allow you to enrol, the faculty coordinator will have to add you to the system manually: e.g. **KAA/AJC3, AJC4, AJC5**. **Make sure to give her the details, i.e. day and time of the class)**

# Changes in the LA I

- During **the first week of the semester**, students attend the classes they are interested in and finalise their LAs.
- You can keep, add or drop courses
- The finalised list of English dept. courses must be **consulted** with the coordinator at the Department of English and American Studies (you will avoid trouble with unsuitable courses etc.)
- By the end of the second week, you must **enrol** in UP STAG in all courses you will be actually attending; if you have a problem, send an email to English dept. coordinator (giving the details, i.e. code, day, time of the KAA course)
- Make sure not to miss the deadline for changes (**end of week 2**) – after the deadline, department coordinators cannot access STAG to make any changes

# Changes in the LA II

- It is equally important to **unenrol** (i.e. to NOT have in the UP Portal) from the courses you are not taking – otherwise you will get an F at the end of the semester. This can be done in the UP Portal during the first two weeks of the semester
- once you have the final list approved, make the respective changes in STAG, generate a pdf with the During the Mobility section and have it signed by both the sending and receiving coordinators
- upload the signed form in STAG

**Solution 1:** try to enrol as soon as possible

**Solution 2** (temporary): Teachers can add you manually as Student-Asynchron, but you have to log in Moodle first so that Moodle knows you.

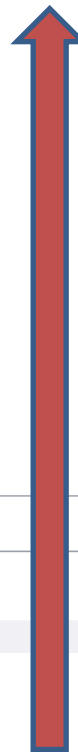

# Practical English: Prerequisites

## Technical glitch:

**KAA/AJC3, AJC4, AJC5 have prerequisites in STAG which will not allow you to enrol.** If you have one of these courses in your LA, get in touch with Ms Simona Černá during the second week of the semester. The faculty coordinator will have to enroll you manually  
! Make sure to provide all the details, i.e. code, day, time.

# So what to do next? (1)

1. In the timetable, check what is actually taught this semester and compare it with the Before mobility section of your LA
2. Make a list of courses you would like to attend
3. Consult your choice of courses taught at the English department with the department coordinator (Helena Tylšarová) and then
4. **Use the first week to learn more about the courses:** go to the first lesson to learn more about the syllabus and requirements (**do not miss the first lesson** even if you have not signed up in STAG yet) and talk to the teacher to find out whether the course is suitable for you  
(do not pick courses for MA students if you are a BA student)
5. **By the end of the first week, you should know which courses you are going to keep, add, or drop**

# So what to do next? (2)

## 6. Enrolment in STAG:

- a) if the teacher says you can attend the course and the capacity in STAG is still full, get in touch with the **English dept. coordinator**. You need to come personally upon previous arrangement in the **first two weeks of the semester** (only English dept. courses can be sorted out this way).
- b) if a course is **not suitable** for whatever reason and you are enrolled in it, make sure to **unenrol** by the end of week 2

7. After finalising the list of courses (**deadline: end of week 2**), make changes in STAG, generate a pdf with the Changes and have it signed by both parties in due time. Then upload it in STAG.
